PROCEEDINGS:

The 2nd Meeting of the Academic Council of Darrang College (Autonomous), Tezpur was held on 29th December 2025 at 11.00 A.M. in the NAB Conference Hall under the Chairmanship of Dr. Palash Moni Saikia, Principal and Chairman of the Academic Council.

The Chairman welcomed the members present and called the meeting to order. The Member Secretary confirmed that the quorum prescribed under the Academic Regulations of the College was present. The Council noted the progress made in the implementation of autonomy and various academic reforms undertaken by the College since its previous meeting.

The Council further noted that the **Academic Regulations, 2025** approved by the Academic Council had been ratified by the Governing Body at its Meeting held on 29-11-2025 vide Resolution No. **GB/2025/05/01**, and that the **Examination Regulations, 2025** had been approved by the Governing Body at the same Meeting vide Resolution No. **GB/2025/05/02**, in accordance with the provisions governing autonomous colleges.

The Council thereafter proceeded to consider the agenda items as circulated. The deliberations held and the decisions taken thereon are recorded below.

PART – A **ACTION TAKEN REPORT**

Agenda No. DC/AC/2/2025/01 to DC/AC/2/2025/01:

Confirmation of the Minutes of the 1st Meeting of the Academic Council and Consideration of the Action Taken Report

Deliberations

The Council considered the Minutes of the 1st Meeting of the Academic Council held on 12 August 2025 together with the Action Taken Report on the resolutions adopted therein. The Member Secretary presented the status of implementation of the decisions taken by the Council and apprised the members of the progress achieved in respect of academic, regulatory and administrative matters.

The Council noted with satisfaction that substantial progress had been achieved in implementing the resolutions adopted at its previous meeting and in advancing the institutional reforms associated with autonomous status and the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The members particularly noted the operationalisation of the Academic Regulations and Examination Regulations, implementation of the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP), development of programme structures and curricula through the respective Boards of Studies, strengthening of

examination and evaluation processes, and progress in the implementation of student-centric initiatives such as the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC).

The Council further noted that decisions requiring statutory approval had subsequently been considered and ratified by the Governing Body, thereby facilitating their implementation in accordance with the provisions governing autonomous colleges.

The Action Taken Report was thereafter considered item-wise.

After detailed consideration of the Action Taken Report, the Council noted that:

1. The Academic Regulations, 2025 and Examination Regulations, 2025 had been successfully operationalised and were being implemented effectively across the institution.
2. The provisions relating to Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) had been implemented in accordance with the approved regulations, supported by ICT-enabled examination and evaluation mechanisms.
3. Significant progress had been achieved in curriculum development under the FYUGP framework, with most Departments completing syllabus preparation up to Semester VIII. The remaining Departments were advised to expedite submission of the pending Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) syllabi.
4. The Academic Calendar and Holiday List approved by the Academic Council had been implemented successfully, including the **incorporation of Ali-Aye-Ligang** as approved by the Council.
5. The decisions of the Academic Council requiring statutory approval had subsequently been ratified by the Governing Body, ensuring compliance with the provisions governing autonomous colleges.

The Council expressed satisfaction over the progress achieved in implementing the resolutions adopted at its previous meeting and observed that the actions taken were consistent with the objectives of academic autonomy, quality enhancement and effective implementation of NEP 2020.

The Council appreciated the efforts made by the Departments, Boards of Studies, Examination Branch, IQAC and other academic and administrative units in ensuring the effective implementation of the decisions of the Academic Council.

The Council noted with satisfaction the progress achieved in implementing the resolutions adopted at its previous meeting and appreciated the efforts made by the Departments, Boards of Studies, Examination Cell, IQAC and other academic and administrative units in ensuring their effective implementation.

PART – B ITEMS FOR CONSIDERATION

Agenda No. DC/AC/2/2025/08

Approval of FYUGP and Postgraduate Syllabi Recommended by the Boards of Studies

Deliberations

The Council considered the recommendations of the respective Boards of Studies relating to the curricula and programme structures of the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) and the proposed Postgraduate Programmes prepared in accordance with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the National Higher Education Qualifications Framework (NHEQF), relevant UGC guidelines and the Academic Regulations of the College.

The Council noted that the proposed curricula and programme structures had been developed by the respective Departments and duly recommended by the Boards of Studies after detailed academic scrutiny and deliberation. The members examined the programme structures, course contents, credit distribution, learning outcomes, assessment framework and other academic components incorporated in the proposed curricula.

The Council further considered the list of Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC) and Value Added Courses (VAC) proposed under the FYUGP framework and recommended by the respective Boards of Studies. After detailed deliberation, the Council approved the following courses for implementation.

The Council noted that the above courses were aligned with the objectives of NEP 2020 and approved their implementation as part of the FYUGP curriculum framework from the Academic Session concerned.

Further resolved that the respective Departments shall take necessary measures for the effective implementation and periodic review of the approved curricula in accordance with the provisions of NEP 2020 and other applicable regulatory requirements.

Approval of Examination Rules, Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) and End Semester Examination (ESE) Pattern

Deliberations

The Council considered the Examination Rules and Evaluation Framework placed by the Controller of Examinations. The members reviewed the provisions relating to Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE), End Semester Examinations (ESE), moderation, result processing and examination governance.

The Council examined the proposed framework in the context of the Academic Regulations of the College, the principles of outcome-based education and the requirements of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The members observed that the framework provided an appropriate balance between continuous assessment and end-semester evaluation and incorporated adequate safeguards to ensure transparency, fairness, academic integrity and accountability.

The Council further noted that the proposed examination system would strengthen student learning outcomes, improve assessment quality and facilitate efficient conduct of examinations under the autonomous framework.

Resolution No. DC/AC/2/2025/03:

Resolved that the Examination Rules and Evaluation Framework, including the Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) and End Semester Examination (ESE) Pattern, be and are hereby approved for implementation.

Further resolved that the Controller of Examinations shall take necessary measures to ensure transparency, confidentiality, academic integrity and timely publication of results under the autonomous examination system.

Agenda No. DC/AC/2/2025/10

Approval of Academic Calendar and Holiday List for the Year 2026

Deliberations

The Council considered the Academic Calendar and Holiday List for the year 2026 prepared in accordance with academic requirements, Government notifications and institutional priorities.

The members examined the proposed Academic Calendar and observed that it provided adequate provision for teaching-learning activities, examinations, co-curricular and extension activities, student support programmes and institutional events while ensuring compliance with the minimum instructional days prescribed under the applicable regulations. The Council further noted that the Holiday List had been prepared after due consideration of national, state and regional observances as well as institutional requirements.

The Council expressed satisfaction that the proposed calendar would facilitate systematic academic planning and timely completion of all academic activities during the year.

The Council unanimously approved the proposals and recommended their implementation from the beginning of the Academic Year 2026.

Resolved that the Academic Calendar for the year 2026 be and is hereby approved for implementation.

Resolution No. DC/AC/2/2025/05:

Resolved that the Holiday List for the year 2026 be and is hereby approved and notified.

Approval of the Panel of Examiners

Deliberations

The Council considered the Panel of Examiners recommended by the respective Boards of Studies. The members noted that the proposed panel comprised qualified academicians and subject experts drawn from recognised institutions and had been prepared in accordance with the Examination Regulations of the College.

The Council observed that the proposed panel represented an appropriate combination of academic expertise and disciplinary competence and would contribute to maintaining the quality, objectivity and credibility of the examination and evaluation process.

Resolved that the Panel of Examiners as recommended by the respective Boards of Studies be and is hereby approved.

Further resolved that the Controller of Examinations be authorized to make minor modifications, if necessary, in consultation with the Chairman, Academic Council.

Approval of Certificate and Short-Term Courses

Deliberations

The Council considered the proposals relating to Certificate and Short-Term Courses submitted by the concerned academic units. The members observed that the proposed courses had been designed to address emerging educational, professional and societal needs and would contribute to skill development, employability enhancement, lifelong learning and community engagement.

The Council appreciated the initiative and noted that such courses would strengthen academic outreach, promote value-added learning opportunities and enhance the capacity of the institution to respond to changing educational and workforce requirements.

Resolved that the Certificate and Short-Term Courses proposed by the concerned academic units be and are hereby approved.

Further resolved that the respective academic units shall finalize the operational modalities in accordance with the applicable regulations of the College.

Agenda No. DC/AC/2/2025/13

Consideration of Proposals for New Academic Programmes and Postgraduate Admissions

Deliberations

The Council considered the proposals for introduction of new academic programmes and reviewed the recommendations received from the concerned Departments and Boards of Studies.

The members examined the academic rationale, availability of qualified faculty, infrastructural facilities, laboratory and library resources, student demand and long-term sustainability of the proposed programmes. The Council observed that the proposals were academically sound and consistent with the strategic vision of the institution for expansion and diversification of academic programmes.

The Council further noted that the proposed programmes would strengthen the academic profile of the College, create additional opportunities for higher learning and research, and address emerging educational needs of the region.

After detailed deliberation, the Council found the proposals academically feasible, institutionally relevant and consistent with the strategic academic development plan of the College. The Council further observed that the proposed programmes would contribute significantly to the expansion of postgraduate education and academic opportunities in the region and accordingly recommended their approval as detailed below.

Resolution No. DC/AC/2/2025/08(a):

Resolved that the proposal for introduction of the M.Sc. Programme in Chemistry under Self-Financing Mode with effect from the Academic Session 2026–27 be and is hereby approved, subject to fulfilment of all applicable academic, infrastructural and statutory requirements.

Resolution No. DC/AC/2/2025/08(b):

Resolved that the proposal for introduction of the M.Com. Programme under Self-Financing Mode with effect from the Academic Session 2026–27 be and is hereby approved, subject to fulfilment of all applicable academic, infrastructural and statutory requirements.

Resolution No. DC/AC/2/2025/09(a)

Resolved that the proposal for introduction of Bodo as a Major Programme under the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) with effect from the Academic Session 2026–27 be and is hereby approved.

Resolution No. DC/AC/2/2025/09(b):

Resolved that the proposal for introduction of Tourism and Travel Management as a Major Programme under the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) with effect from the Academic Session 2026–27 be and is hereby approved.

Agenda No. DC/AC/2/2025/14

Roadmap for Introduction of the Ph.D. Programme

Deliberations

The Council considered the roadmap for introduction of the Ph.D. Programme at Darrang College (Autonomous). The members discussed the institutional preparedness for research, availability of eligible supervisors, research infrastructure, research governance mechanisms and the requirements prescribed under the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedures for Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2022.

The Council observed that the introduction of doctoral programmes would significantly strengthen the research ecosystem of the institution, promote advanced scholarship and facilitate the creation of a vibrant research culture. The members emphasized the importance of maintaining high academic and ethical standards in all research-related activities.

The Council further emphasized the need to maintain the highest standards of research quality, academic integrity, publication ethics and research governance in the proposed doctoral programme.

Resolution No. DC/AC/2/2025/10:

Resolved that the roadmap for introduction of the Ph.D. Programme at Darrang College (Autonomous) be and is hereby approved in principle.

Further resolved that the draft Ph.D. Regulations be finalized and processed through the appropriate statutory authorities for consideration and approval.

Further resolved that the proposed doctoral programme shall be implemented in conformity with the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedures for Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2022 and amendments issued from time to time.

Agenda No. DC/AC/2/2025/15

Implementation of Academic Bank of Credits (ABC), APAAR and Multiple Entry–Exit Framework under NEP 2020

Deliberations

The Council reviewed the measures undertaken by the College for implementation of the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC), APAAR and the Multiple Entry–Exit framework under NEP 2020.

The members noted the progress made in student registration, maintenance of digital academic records and integration with the national academic credit ecosystem. The Council observed that these initiatives would enhance student mobility, academic flexibility, credit portability and lifelong learning opportunities in accordance with the objectives of NEP 2020.

The members emphasized the need for continued awareness, capacity-building and technical support to ensure effective implementation of the framework.

The Council further emphasized the importance of continuous awareness, orientation and capacity-building programmes for students, faculty members and administrative staff to ensure effective implementation of the framework.

The meeting recommended that the measures undertaken by the College for implementation of the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) and the Multiple Entry–Exit framework under the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 be implemented.

Further suggested that all Departments and administrative units shall take necessary measures to facilitate effective implementation of the prescribed framework.

Agenda No. DC/AC/2/2025/16

Any Other Matter with the Permission of the Chair

Deliberations

The Council considered various academic and administrative matters raised with the permission of the Chair. The members exchanged views on issues relating to academic quality enhancement, promotion of research and innovation, strengthening of student support systems, faculty development and future academic initiatives.

The Council emphasized the need for continuous review and improvement of academic processes in conformity with the objectives of institutional autonomy, quality assurance and the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The members also observed that emerging academic issues requiring policy intervention should be placed before the appropriate statutory authorities for consideration and necessary action.

Announcement

The Council noted that the next meeting of the Academic Council is proposed to be held during the last week of June 2026.

CONCLUSION

The Academic Council noted with satisfaction the progress made in the implementation of autonomy and the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and appreciated the efforts of the Departments, Boards of Studies, Examination Branch, IQAC and various Committees in carrying forward academic and institutional reforms. The Council also noted the significant developments relating to postgraduate education, introduction of new academic programmes, implementation of the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC), and initiatives towards establishment of doctoral research programmes. The observations and suggestions made by the members during the deliberations were duly noted for appropriate follow-up action. The Chairman thanked the members for their active participation and valuable contributions to the deliberations. The members expressed their appreciation to the Chair for the effective conduct of the proceedings.
